## Admission Process



### Elegibility

- Minimum grade of 8.5 for undergraduate students and 8.0 for graduate students (according to the Mexican grading system) or as specified in external calls.
- Must have completed at least 20 courses in their undergraduate program or the first semester of graduate studies, or as indicated in external calls.
- Must not be in the final term of their study plan.
- Proof of Spanish proficiency at a minimum B1 level.
- Proof of English proficiency at a minimum B1 level (if the requested courses are taught in English).

## Application Process

- **Home Institution:** Will nominate the student by sending the following documents to the email address [mov.entrada@uacj.mx](mailto:mov.entrada@uacj.mx)
  1. The UACJ application form filled out on a computer and signatures. Application\_form\_inbound\_exchange.pdf
  2. Application letter addressed to the Deputy of the Cooperation and International Office Yadira Isela Márquez González, MBA.
  3. Official identification with a photograph of the student with a legible image.

Students: Once the nomination is received by the home Institution, the international office, performs a pre-registration in the UACJ Student Mobility System and subsequently the student will receive an email requiring to complete the registration with personal, academic information and file integration, students will have a period of 7 days from the day the email is sent to complete the registration, otherwise, their application will be canceled; a link, user and password to enter at Student Mobility System and a manual to upload documents will be provided in the email.

### Personal Documents:

1. Front photograph, following the instructions in the platform manual.

### File Documents:

2. Copy of passport or proof of processing. Requirement: passport valid at least 6 months after the end date of the mobility (applies to international students on site modality).



3. Statement of purpose translated in Spanish (minimum one page, maximum 2 pages) in .pdf format.
4. Transcript of courses (Academic History or Cardex) in .pdf format.
5. Recommendation letter from a professor of the home institution, translated in Spanish in .pdf format.
6. Proof of Spanish Language Proficiency in .pdf format, (for those whose language is different than Spanish).
7. Proof of English Language Proficiency (B1) in .pdf format, if a class you are planning to take is taught in this language.

### Validation and acceptance

The applications received will be validated and will be sent to the corresponding academic areas, who will corroborate the participation according to the requested subject(s) and the file.

From the corresponding validations, the students will receive the result obtained as appropriate:

**Accepted:** An email will be sent to the student to consult the acceptance letter in the Student Mobility System and submit the complementary documents of the file.

a. Virtual modality:

1. Commitment letter

b. In Person modality:

1. Commitment letter

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2. Travel medical insurance that covers life insurance, funeral service for repatriation of remains and others that are included in this call.

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3. Arrival itinerary (date, time, airline and flight number).

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4. Lodging address and a copy of bill service of the place where you will stay.

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5. Immigration permits or visa passport (applies only to international students).

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
6. Other documents in case to apply.

**Not accepted:** You will be informed if any course cannot be offered in the requested semester, options will be provided to change subject(s). The UACJ application form will be requested to be updated.



## SPECIFICATIONS

- Student's applications will be received by the national and international higher Education Institutions (IES) from bilateral collaboration agreements and collaboration consortiums with the UACJ.
- The number of students accepted will be as established by the agreement, participation consortium, or available spaces in the virtual academic offer.
- The UACJ will not charge the participants student with any cost related to registration, ID number, or academic certificates, according to the reciprocity among the IES participants.
- The participant students in the program must be registered in their home institution and without academic conditionality at the time of requesting participation in the UACJ.
- In case of choosing subjects in the English language, it must prove the B1 level proficiency.
- The period of stay is for one semester (1) with the possibility of extension up to one year.
- **In-person mobility** will follow up with the health regulations and measures issued by the competent authorities, maybe subject modifications that will timely be communicated.
- In the case of **virtual modality**, all the courses and activities will be 100% virtual, none of them will be face-to-face. This condition also covers teaching materials and other resources associated with courses or subjects offered.
- Undergraduate students will not be able to participate in the postgraduate courses offered.
- Students may only participate in classes corresponding to one academic program registered at UACJ.



## FACE TO FACE ACADEMIC MODALITY

Once the student is accepted, must get a medical insurance that includes life insurance, funeral service for repatriation of remains (if international), medical expenses, and hospitalization for coronavirus (COVID-19). This is mandatory, even the mobility is national, without exceptions and must complete with the following:

- It must be issued by an insurance company (not a bank).
- It must be issued as service insurance, not a reimbursement one.
- Medical insurance documents and payment receipts should be sent by email to this office at least two weeks before arriving to the city.
- It must be paid in full and must expire at least two weeks after the stipulated date of return to their city.
- You must have this insurance regardless of having social security, public, or free insurance provided by scholarship organizations that do not comply with the provisions.
- Once the acceptance is received, you can contact the insurance company from the options that will be provided.

### Arrival protocol of exchange students to the UACJ

The reception of students at the Ciudad Juárez Internacional airport will be carried out by the Cooperation and Internationalization office, and is subject to availability, so the student's arrival must be reported in advance, providing an itinerary (date, arrival time, flight number, airline and address).

### Student temporary residence in Mexico

Foreign students must adhere to the requirements established by the Foreign Secretary, the Mexican Consulate General and the National Institute of Migration.
