History

The Universidad Autónoma de Ciudad Juárez (UACJ), was founded in 1973 as a result of the integration of three higher education institutes: the Universidad Femenina, the Universidad Mixta, and the Universidad Ciudad Juárez A.C. currently known as the Universidad Autónoma de Ciudad Juárez.

On the 29th of January 1973, the President of Mexico Luis Echeverría Álvarez laid the first stone of what would become the Universidad Autónoma de Ciudad Juárez.



“We will lay the first stone so that the Planning Commission immediately points out the locations in the different pieces of land and has the University’s construction started, so that in a few months it can get to work.”

President Echeverría promised to return before the end of the year to inaugurate the University.

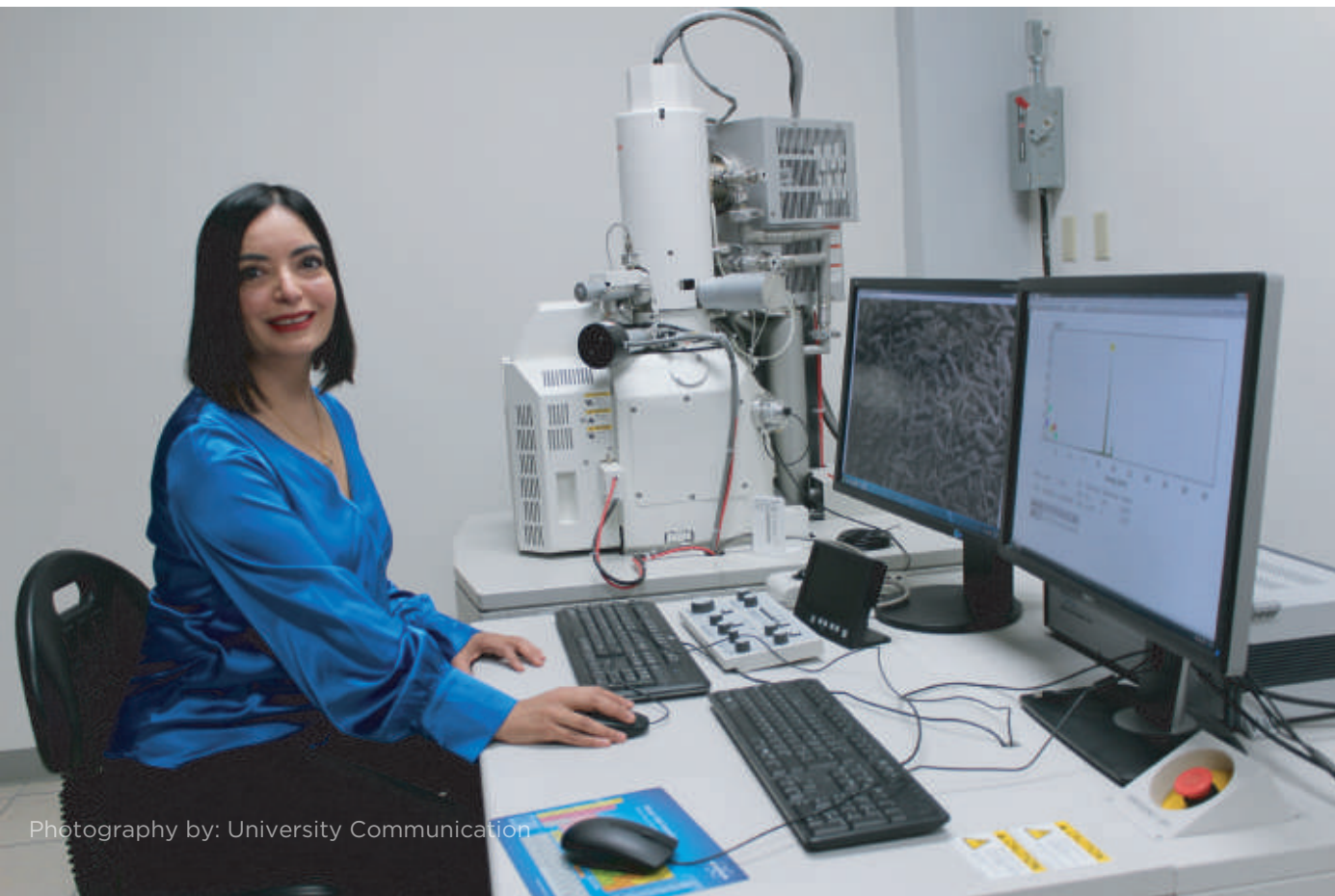


Awards and distinctions

Process

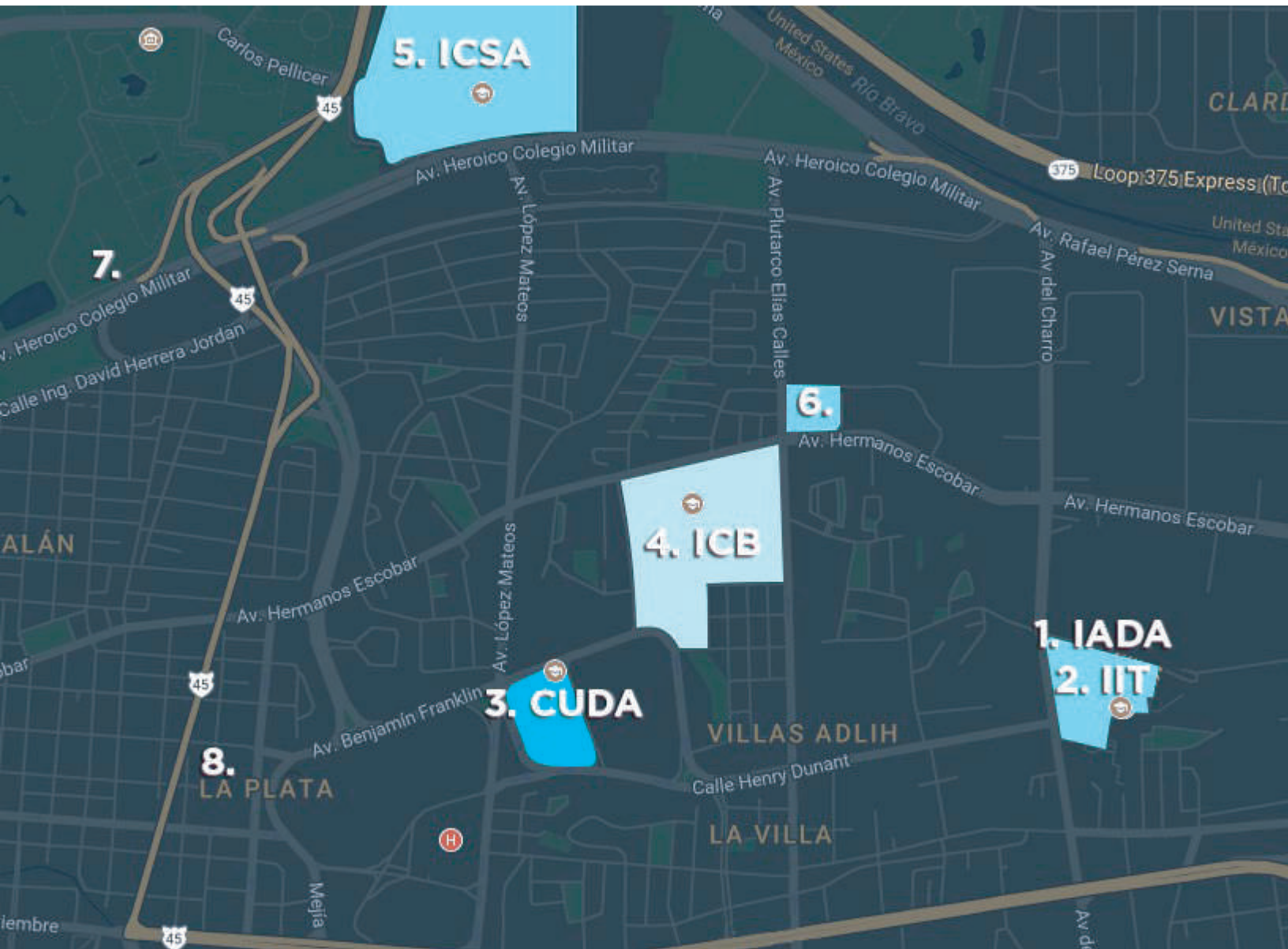

WELCOME MEETING

By the Cooperation and Internationalization Office (SCI)



Attendance at the welcome meeting is mandatory, which aims to provide an introduction to UACJ services, registration process, student ID's, enrollment in courses, introduction to program coordinators, facilities' tour, bank account processing and expense verification process. This meeting takes place from 9:00 AM to 3 PM and generally takes place on a Friday before the school year begins.

REGISTRATION

To the UACJ through the SCI



The Student Mobility Office will inform you of the date on which the Office of Academic Services will have you enroll at the institution. A registration number will be generated with which you will have the status of visiting student.

COORDINATOR

Introduction to the coordinator and academic tutor



On the day of the induction course, a visit is made with the Program Coordinators in order for them to meet the students and guide them regarding the courses you will be taking and the academic activities in the semester. The UACJ tutor will monitor your stay, which will report on the academic performance during your stay, as well as provide academic support in any field.



Student ID

If you are going to carry out an academic stay (4 to 6 months) you will be able to do the process to obtain the student's card in digital format, through the Conecta UACJ application. To do this, once you have your registration number, you must send a photograph in accordance with the specifications of the General Directorate of Academic Services.

SANTANDER UNIVERSITIES BANKING ACCOUNT



If you have a scholarship from the UACJ, you must apply for a Santander Universities account at the bank located at the Institute of Social Sciences and Administration. The bank will ask you for a copy of your passport and proof of address. You must submit a copy of your Santander account at the SCI.

Checking costs

In case of receiving a scholarship from the UACJ, you must invoice the amount of the scholarship in the name of the institution, submitting invoices in xml and pdf format ordered monthly.

Invoices must be requested digitally at convenience stores or supermarkets and must include only food items. The invoices of the means of transport used (uber, taxi, etc.) must also be added.

Lastly, the lease of the place where you stayed must be delivered physically.

END OF STAY



You must submit the following documentation for **closing** your stay to the Student Mobility Office:

1. Academic-personal memoir (Times New Roman 12, 1.5 spacing, 2 pages or 500 words max).
2. Photographic memory (2 significant pictures of your stay, one in campus and another one somewhere out in Juárez), or a short video with a brief experience about your stay.
3. Financial verification if you received a scholarship from the UACJ.
4. The satisfaction survey of the service provided.

CIUDAD JUÁREZ



The city

Ciudad Juárez is located in the north of Mexico, in the state of Chihuahua, by the Río Bravo. On the other side of the river, on US land, we can find the city of El Paso (Texas). Due to its population of over 1,400,000 million inhabitants, it's considered to be the largest city in the state of Chihuahua and the eighth largest metropolitan area in Mexico.

Juárez has an economy based on the assembly plant industry, made up of over 200 companies, which are strategically located on border bridges and quick access areas, have US investors, and have a market based on the export of merchandise.





The weather

The weather in Ciudad Juárez is very extreme. In the summer temperatures can reach up to 45 degrees Celsius and in the winter they can go down to -15 degrees Celsius. Due to its location in the Chihuahuan desert, Ciudad Juárez has a desert climate in which temperatures vary greatly from season to season. The rainy season is normally recorded between the months of July and August.

Clothing

If your stay is during the semester from January to June, you will be in the coldest months of the year at the beginning, where the maximum temperature can be 10 degrees Celsius and the minimum of -10, so it is recommended that you bring a jacket, sweaters, sweatshirts, or any other winter clothing that you consider. From mid-April, the temperature changes and you can start wearing lighter clothes, so we recommend that you include short-sleeved clothes in your suitcase.

If you do not have the option of buying a good jacket in your city, you can do it upon arrival, however, it is extremely important that you bring a thick sweater or sweatshirt to mitigate the change in weather.

If your stay is in the semester from August to December, it is recommended to bring mostly light clothing since you will have some summer months, where the maximum temperature can be 45 degrees Celsius and the minimum 18 degrees Celsius. From the end of October, the temperature changes and the cold begins, in addition, during the summer months, classrooms can feel very cold since they turn on air conditioning equipments, so it is recommended that you include sweaters in your suitcase and/or sweatshirts, or even a jacket.



Currency

The currency used in Mexico is called the Mexican peso (Mxn). In Ciudad Juárez, most establishments accept debit or credit cards, but it is convenient to bring a little cash because some of them or means of transport do not accept cards. Likewise, due to its proximity to the US, it is common for establishments to accept US dollars.

Taxi

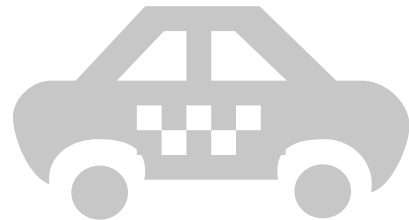
It is not commonly used due to its high rates.

GET TO KNOW

WHAT TO SEE IN CIUDAD JUÁREZ?

Museum of Revolution in the Borderland (MUREF)

The MUREF shows the historical events that took place in Ciudad Juárez during the first two decades of the 20th century, during the revolutionary movement against Porfirio Díaz. Through 9 thematic axes of permanent exhibition, the MUREF shows why Juárez' people are heirs and legitimate representatives of a prestigious past.



Archaeology and History Museum of El Chamizal

Located in the Chamizal Federal Public Park, its objective is to promote pre-Hispanic cultures and artistic manifestations of the region, the country and abroad. In its beautiful gardens there are some reproductions of characteristic pieces of these cultures, such as Mayan faces, Aztec jaguars or Olmec heads. In addition, there are temporary painting and/or sculpture exhibitions, so do not forget to check those out!



The Rodadora Interactive Museum

Located in downtown, and is one of the largest museums in Latin America; with over 120 interactive and fun exhibits, you can find science, technology, art and culture combined in a single place, making it a unique and different space. La Rodadora counts with a 60% of its exhibits specially designed to celebrate the wealth of Ciudad Juárez, the state of Chihuahua and its people. The theme that this interactive space addresses includes the analysis of the natural and social environment to recognize the identity and diversity of the region and its two great geographical challenges: A desert and a border.

Monument Mexicanidad

Inaugurated on May 24, 2013, the Monument Mexicanidad, also called “La X”, is a 64-meter-high monumental work by Mexican artist Enrique Carbajal, better known by the name of Sebastián.



This intense red, X-shaped metal structure stands in the new Plaza de la Mexicanidad located in the El Chamizal Federal Public Park, on a strip of land that a little more than half a century ago was still located between Ciudad Juárez and the Río Bravo and belonged to the United States, because in the 1800s the river was diverted and that part stayed on the North American side.

The Plaza de la Mexicanidad is a park whose dimensions allow for massive events to take place, and in fact there is a stage that often hosts concerts, one of the most remembered ones being its inauguration with Juan Gabriel, the “Divo de Juárez”, who did the honors and caused the first full house in the place.

The Ciudad Juárez Museum of Art

At the moment, plastic works by contemporary Mexican artists are being temporarily exhibited. Due to its location, the museum also houses the work of foreign artists, especially North Americans.

It has been the venue for exhibitions of great local plastic artists, national and international such as: Rufino Tamayo, José Luis Cuevas, Sebastian, Luis Nichizawa, Vicente Rojo Manuel, among others.



La casa de adobe (The adobe house)

Small house located just four meters from the border with the United States. It was the National Palace, a war room, a negotiating table and even a kitchen for the revolutionary troops.

El Chamizal Federal Public Park

Urban park that is one of the most important sites in the history of Ciudad Juárez. It is an ideal place for family and sports recreation that Juárez counts with.



Borunda Park

One of the places with a lot of the city's tradition and customs, it was created in the mid-70's. It has rides, food stalls, outdoor stages, playgrounds and green spaces.

Central Park

It's located next to the La Rodadora Interactive Museum. Central Park has a large artificial lake surrounded by tree-lined gardens where you can rent rowing boats. In addition, it has green areas, domesticated animals, outdoor settings and a botanical garden.



Historic Center

A walk through the historic center of the city, touring the streets, is like listening to the legends that Juárez has for you. Some places located there are the Cathedral, the mission of Guadalupe, Mercado Cuauhtémoc, craft shops, different museums, and the legendary Avenida Juárez which is located a few meters from one of the cross borders with the US.



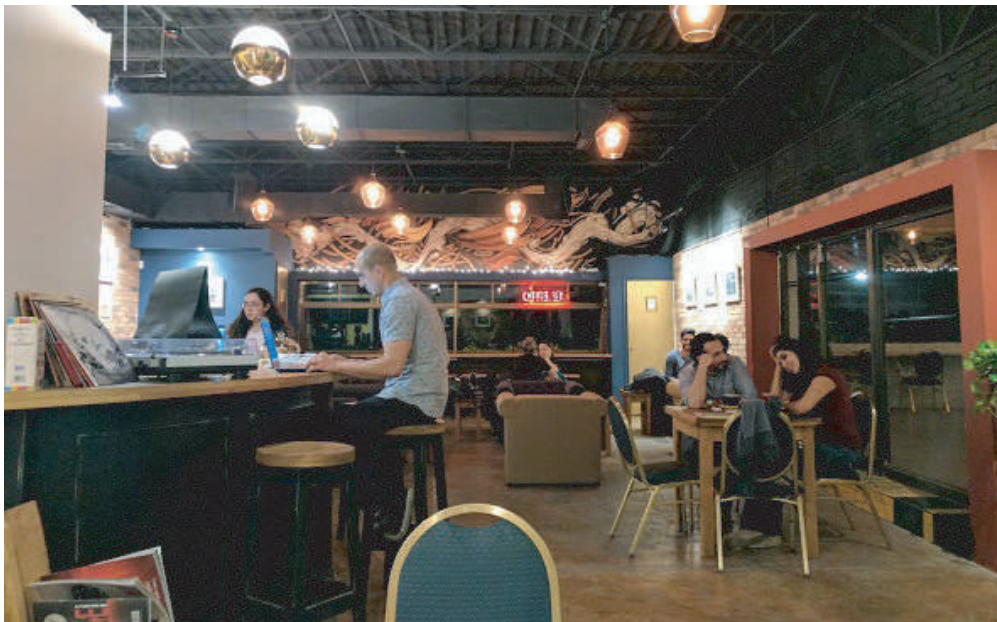
Samalayuca Dune Fields

This place is a small part of the Chihuahuan desert, whose territory is over 17 thousand hectares big.



Food

The typical cuisine of Juárez is characterized by the famous "burritos", a flour tortilla filled with different stews; in addition to dishes with corn tortillas such as tacos, quesadillas, enchiladas, among others. 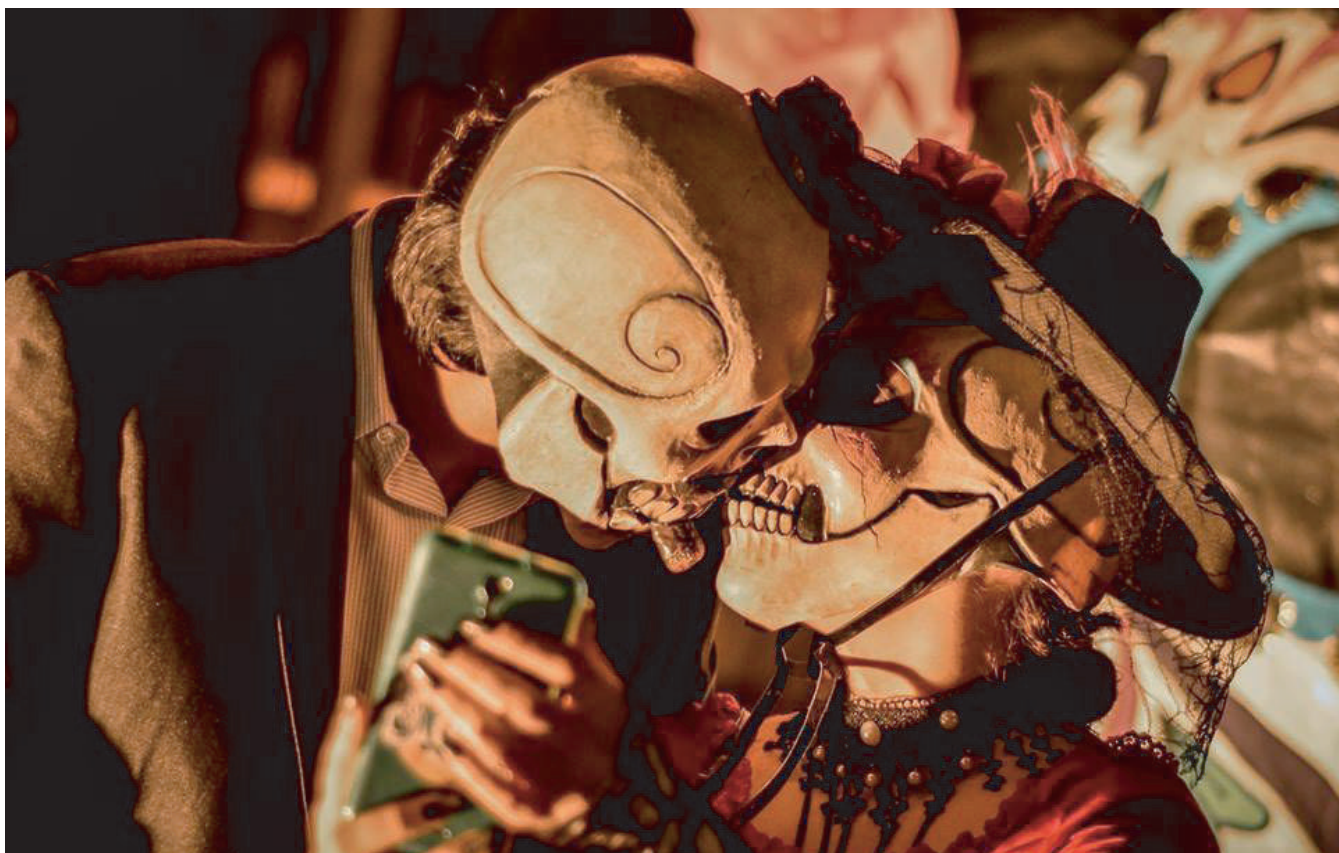
